Abu Raiham Mahamed ibn Ahmed Al-beruni, or an his compatriots called him Abu Raiham, was born in 973 in the feudatory of modern Khiva, then called Khwarizm. He distinguished himself early in Science and Literature and played a political part as councilor of the ruling prince of this native country of the Mamuni family. Alberuni felt a strong inclination toward Indian Philosophy, and he seems to have thought that the philosophers in both India and Greece held, in reality, the very same ideas monotheism. In the opening of the book he gives the circumstance that led him to write this book. Alberuni came to India with the invading armies of the Mahumud of Ghazni, and this particular work is dated to belong to the early 11th century A.D. and is exhaustive in its compass.
